

The United States Mint is issuing 56 quarters featuring designs depicting national parks and other national sites as part of its America the Beautiful Quarters Program. Five new national site designs, depicted on the reverse (tails), will be released each year in the order in which the honored site was first established as a national site, with one final design in 2021.

The United States Mint America the Beautiful Quarters Program is a multi-year initiative to honor 56 national parks and other national sites in each state, the District of Columbia and five U.S. territories—Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands and the Northern Mariana Islands.

The 2015 United States Mint America the Beautiful Quarters will be released in the following order:

- Homestead National Monument of America, Nebraska
- Kisatchie National Forest, Louisiana
- Blue Ridge Parkway, North Carolina
- Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge, Delaware
- Saratoga National Historical Park, New York

HOMESTEAD NATIONAL MONUMENT OF AMERICA Nebraska

One of the more significant events in the westward expansion, the Homestead Act of 1862 granted 160 acres of free land to claimants and allowed nearly any man or woman a "fair chance." Located in southeast Nebraska, Homestead National Monument of America commemorates this act and the profound impact it had on the landscape and its people. It was first established as a national site on March 19, 1936. The reverse design represents the three fundamentals of survival common to all homesteaders: food, shelter and water.

KISATCHIE NATIONAL FOREST Louisiana

Spread across seven parishes in Louisiana, Kisatchie National Forest is divided into five managed units called ranger districts. One of Louisiana's treasured sites concealed in the bayous, beneath bald Cyprus groves, Kisatchie National Forest is looked at as a world of natural beauty, excitement, learning, recreation, resources and wildlife in their purest form. It was first established as a national site on June 3. 1936. The reverse design features a wild turkey in flight over blue stem grass with long leaf pine in the background.

BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY North Carolina

Boasting stunning long-range vistas and close-up views of the rugged mountains and picture-perfect landscapes of the Appalachian Highlands, the Blue Ridge Parkway offers a slow-paced and relaxing drive, making for an experience unlike any other. Consisting of 469 miles, the parkway protects a variety of plants and animals and provides opportunities to enjoy what makes this region of the country so picturesque. It was first established as a national site on June 30, 1936. The reverse design depicts the grace and curvature of the road hugging the side of a mountain with the North Carolina state flower in the foreground.













BOMBAY HOOK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE Delaware

Located along the coast of Delaware, Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge protects one of the largest remaining areas of tidal salt marsh in the mid-Atlantic region. The refuge also includes freshwater impoundments, as well as upland habitats that are managed for other wildlife. It was first established as a national site on June 22, 1937. The reverse design features a great blue heron in the foreground and a great egret in the background.

SARATOGA NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK Vew York

Saratoga National Historical Park marks the spot where American forces met, defeated and forced the British Army to surrender in the autumn of 1777. A crucial American victory, this renewed the hope for independence, secured vital foreign support and forever changed the face of the world. It was first established as a national site on June 1, 1938. The reverse design is a close-up of the moment General John Burgovne surrendered his sword to General Horatio Gates, a turning point many believe marked the "beginning of the end of the . American Revolutionary War."

GEORGE WASHINGTON Obverse

Each coin in this series features a common obverse (heads) with the 1932 portrait of George Washington by John Flanagan, restored to bring out subtle details and the beauty of the original model.
