



# Andrew Johnson




*The Andrew Johnson National Historic Site explores the early life, political career, and legacy of the nation's 17th President. Today, the park preserves two of his homes, his tailor shop, and his burial site located within Andrew Johnson National Cemetery.*

*In 1865, Johnson was tasked with restoring the nation after President Lincoln's tragic death. Through the turbulent period of Reconstruction, Johnson relied on his 40 years of public service and governed using the U.S. Constitution as his guide. His presidency shaped the future of the United States and his influences continue today.*

**How To Get Here:**

The national historic site is located in northeast Tennessee, 14 miles east of 1-81. From 1-81 northbound take exit 23 to U.S. 11-E north. From 1-81 southbound take exit 36 to Tennessee Route 172 into Greenville, then right onto U.S. 321 south. Once in Greenville follow the brown signs to the visitor center.

At the visitor center you will be able to visit the Early Home of the president, his Tailor Shop, view exhibits and a 13 minute film, and make reservations for a guided tour of the Homestead. The Homestead is not wheelchair accessible; however, a video of the guided tour is available upon request.



Greenville is Tennessee's second oldest town. Within walking distance of the visitor center are many other interesting attractions such as the state's oldest jail, a replica of the Capitol of the Lost State of Franklin, the Dickson-Williams Mansion, and the Greenville Greene County History Museum. Lodging and dining facilities are located nearby.
