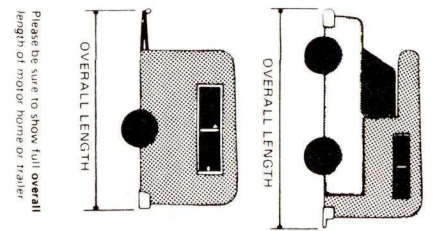

GENERAL RESERVATION INFORMATION

During the summer camping season, listed campgrounds in Grand Canyon, Sequoia-Kings Canyon and Yosemite National Parks are on a reservation basis. You may reserve campsites in person at Ticketron sales terminals located in department stores, sporting goods outlets, and automobile clubs, or by direct mail to the Ticketron address shown on the reservation request form. You may also make reservations at Grand Canyon, Sequoia-Kings Canyon and Yosemite National Parks, and at the National Park Service Western Regional Office in San Francisco and Field Office in Los Angeles. Reservations may be made up to eight weeks in advance.

Reservations may be made at the walk-in outlets no later than the day before the reservation begins. Mail requests should be received by Ticketron at least two weeks in advance so the ticket can be returned prior to your departure from home. You must have your reservation ticket when you check in. The National Park Service and Ticketron are not responsible for delays in postal service.

Phone reservations cannot be accepted.

Reservations are made for a particular park and campground, but specific campsites cannot be reserved. Campsites are assigned when you arrive at the park, and assignments will be based on the type of equipment you indicate on the reservation request form.

Many campgrounds are filled well in advance. Whenever possible, we suggest you indicate alternate campgrounds and dates. Your request will be returned unfilled if the exact dates specified cannot be reserved, unless you authorize Ticketron to reserve a shorter or different period.

When you receive your reservation ticket, examine the center section immediately to be sure that it is for the campground, arrival date and number of nights that you desire. If not, obtain a corrected ticket from the outlet operator, or return it to the mail reservation address immediately.

FEES There is a daily charge for the use of each campsite as shown on the campground list. In addition, there is a \$1.75 reservation fee for each reservation period. In family campgrounds, persons 62 years of age or older possessing a valid **Golden Age Passport** are entitled to a 50 percent reduction in the daily user fee. **Golden Age Passports** must be presented to Ticketron outlet operator, or the passport number shown on mail request at the time of reservation to obtain the reduction in daily user fees. **Golden Age Passports** must be in possession while occupying campsite.

Golden Eagle Passports provide for free entry into the parks, but do not provide a reduction in camping fees.

LENGTH OF STAY Limits on length of stay apply at all sites. Please check listing. Consecutive reservations will not be honored and the party will be requested to vacate campsite.

NUMBER OF PERSONS Individual family units are for use by one family or a party of no more than six persons. Larger groups should contact the Park Superintendent to reserve a group campsite.

ARRIVALS When you arrive at the campground, present your ticket to the Ranger on duty. If campground personnel are not on duty when you arrive, information concerning assignments will be posted at the entrance to the campground.

LATE ARRIVALS Reservations will be held for late arrival only for the first night of your reserved time, unless the park is notified. If you do not arrive by 8:00 a.m. of the next day, and have not notified the Ranger of late arrival, your reservation will be cancelled and made available for another camper.

PETS No extra charge for pets. At Yosemite, pets are permitted only at Upper Pines Campground.

CHECK-OUT TIME Campers cannot be assured of space before noon on the scheduled day of arrival, since that is check-out time.

CAMPSITE INFORMATION Campgrounds on the reservation system have water systems, flush toilets, fireplaces, tables and parking spaces. Utility hookups are not available. Please be sure to show full overall length of camper, motorhome or trailer on your reservation application. If you have extra equipment, such as a boat trailer, be sure to show it. Campsite reservations are made to accommodate your equipment.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS Refunds will be made only when cancellation of the entire reserved period is made, or for cancellation of unused days following an early departure. Refunds are not available for late arrivals. The reservation fee is not refundable, and there is an additional cancellation processing charge that will be deducted from the refund.

If you depart early, you must notify the Ranger by noon of the day of departure to obtain credit for that night and additional unused nights. Refund payments are made by mail, and should be received by you within 60 days.

To cancel your reservations if your date of arrival is:

More than one week away: Send a written request for cancellation to Ticketron, P.O. Box 92212, Los Angeles, CA 90009. Enclose the entire reservation ticket but keep a record of the ticket validation number, dates, and campground.

Less than one week away: Notify the park reservation office. If the notice of cancellation for the entire reservation period is received by letter or phone the day before your scheduled arrival, you will receive a refund of the overnight camp fee less a cancellation fee of \$1.50. (Reservation ticket must be mailed to the Park later if you cancel by phone.) If the notice of cancellation is not received by the day before scheduled arrival, you will receive a refund of the camp unit fee, less a cancellation fee of \$1.50, and less the amount of the first night camping fee.
