THE MAZE DISTRICT

Park regulations serve a dual purpose: They help protect the Park values that you came here to enjoy and they help keep other visitors from reducing your enjoyment of this visit. Please help us to assure that other visitors enjoy their trip as much as we hope you enjoy your visit, today and in the future.

- 1. ALL vehicles must remain on designated routes. A "designated" route is one shown on the map on the other side of this page. All other routes inside Canyonlands National Park and Glen Canyon National Recreation Area are closed to vehicle use.
- 2. Prehistoric objects such as arrowheads, Indian ruins, pictographs or petroglyphs must not be disturbed. They are very easily damaged in the most innocent manner: you don't have to be a malicious vandal to do great damage. So, to help preserve these treasures:
 - a. Do not TOUCH pictographs or petroglyphs; to do so will dislodge sand grains, removing pigments and blurring the figures.
 - b. Do not ENTER or climb on ruins; you cannot do it without dislodging the fragile mortar and, eventually, rocks from the walls.
 - c. Do not STEAL arrowheads, pottery, or other artifacts. It's fun to look for and find them, but most of the fun is in discovering them. Stealing artifacts is simply being greedy. Leave artifacts in place for others to enjoy through discovery.
- 3. Hunting in the Park is prohibited, and all firearms must be cased or broken down and may not be carried or fired in the Park.
- 4. Wood gathering within Canyonlands National Park is not allowed, but dead wood may be collected in Glen Canyon National Recreation Area and upon BLM lands.
- 5. Do not burn or bury your garbage and trash---pack it out when you leave.
- 6. All vehicles must be registered and licensed, and every driver must have a valid driver's license.
