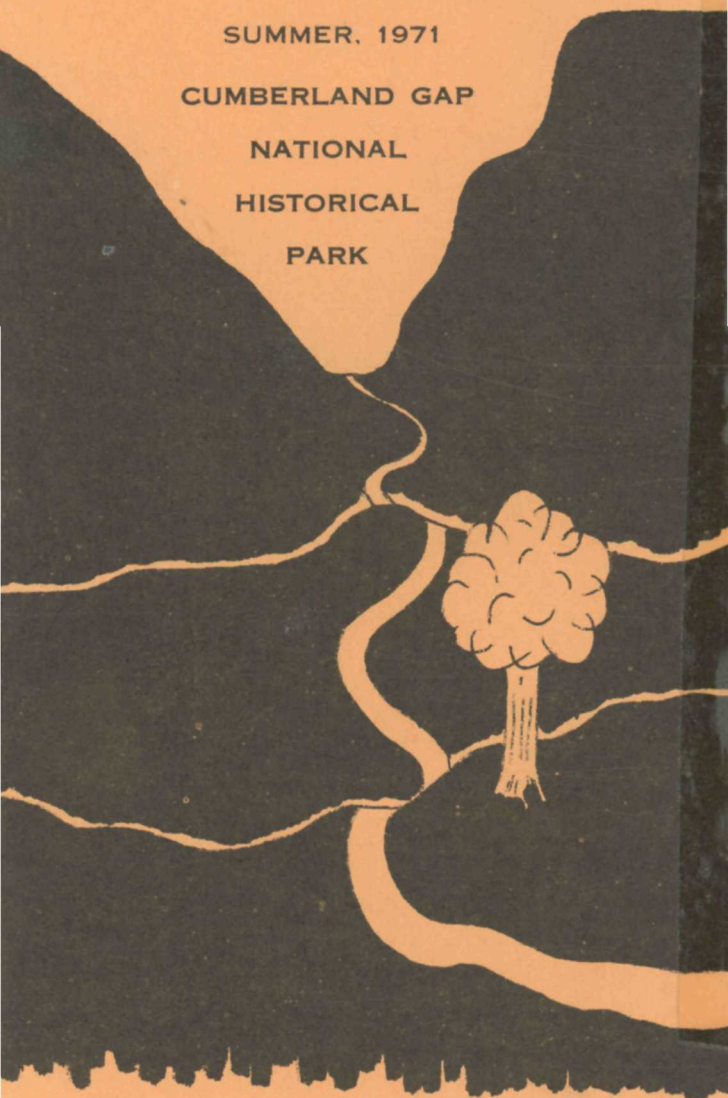

PINNACLE

NATURE WALK

Daily from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Meet at the Pinnacle Interpretive Shelter at 1:50 p.m.

HENSLEY SETTLEMENT

FULL-DAY HISTORY HIKE

All day hike to Hensley Settlement. Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. With your car, meet at the Wilderness Road Campground entrance station at 7:45 a.m. You will caravan to the trail-head. Rigorous.

SAND CAVE

FULL-DAY NATURE HIKE

All day hike to Sand Cave. Sundays from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. With your car, meet at the Wilderness Road Campground entrance station at 7:15 a.m. You will caravan to the trail-head. Rigorous.

WALKS and **HIKES** involve easy walking to strenuous hiking. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Parents should accompany children under 12.

SELF-GUIDED TRAILS



GREEN LEAF NATURE TRAIL

Begins at Wilderness Road Campground amphitheatre entrance. Gentle 0.7 mile walk. One hour.

HONEY TREE SPUR TRAIL

Begins at bridge along the Green Leaf Nature Trail. Rigorous 0.8 mile walk. One hour.



THINGS TO **SEE** AND DO

ORIENTATION SLIDE PROGRAM

Daily every half hour beginning at 8:30 a. m. through 6:30 p. m. at the Visitor Center. 15 minutes in length.

PARK MUSEUM AND VISITOR CENTER

Open Daily from 8:00 a. m. to 7:00 p. m.

DRIVE TO PINNACLE OVERLOOK

The four-mile Pinnacle Drive begins in front of the Visitor Center. Open Daily from 8:00 a. m. to 7:00 p. m.

TRI-STATE MARKER

The spot where the States of Kentucky, Tennessee and Virginia meet. The trail-head for the one mile trail to the marker is located on U. S. 25E in the Gap.

CUMBERLAND IRON FURNACE

The remnants of a nineteenth century iron foundry located in Cumberland Gap, Tennessee.

FORT MCCOOK

A Civil War artillery site situated along the Pinnacle Drive.
