



Look Beneath the Leaves

Every autumn, visitors flock to the Ledges Overlook to enjoy the sea of red, orange, and yellow that blankets the Cuyahoga Valley. While gazing out over the glorious trees, take time to examine the fascinating terrain that lies beneath.

The Ledges outcroppings were formed by layers of sand and pebbles left by ancient streams over 300 million years ago. The rough textures and smooth stones remind us that, given enough time, water, wind, and glaciers can move, build, and destroy even the toughest rocks. Hike carefully among the sandstone formations, feeling the cooler temperatures as you step through a narrow passageway or into the dark of Ice Box Cave.

Deeper, older bedrock was created when the land that is now Ohio lay beneath shallow seas. To see what creatures populated that period, head to Everett Road Covered Bridge and make your way down into the streambed of Furnace Run. A first glance shows rocks of many sizes and colors. A closer look may reveal clues to our watery past: the seashell imprint of a brachiopod and the small ring imprint of a crinoid are two of the most common fossils in northeast Ohio. If you are extremely observant (and lucky), you may find horn coral or the elusive trilobite, Ohio's state fossil.

While on your fossil expedition in the national park, remember these important guidelines. Some hikes involve elevation changes, so bring enough drinking water for your group. Pack a hand lens for examining rock samples. Rinse the rocks to remove sand and other debris to make fossils easier to see. Finally, leave the fossils where you find them. Every visitor deserves the opportunity to discover these pieces of our Earth's history. Instead, use a camera to document your discoveries.

National Earth Science Week is October 9 to 15. CVNP is celebrating with a variety of activities that highlight park geology. Kids can earn the official Junior Paleontology Junior Ranger Badge. See page 2 for details.

Indeed, a spotlight should rest on Muth's strikingly honest vocal delivery and unpretentious, poetic lyrics—but you can't overlook her band, the Lost High Rollers. The soundscapes the band creates match Muth's lyrics flawlessly. Each flutter from the mandolin and every sliding note from the pedal steel seemingly pull the listener down a country road.

Baka Beyond

Joining musicians from five countries in the Celtic fringes of Europe and the west coast of Africa, *Baka Beyond* plays the most original live world fusion sound around. Strong African beats underpin Celtic and Gaelic melodies, producing fast yet gentle rhythms that are totally infectious. This blend makes for a stunning fusion of influences. The spectacular musicianship and improvisational skills of the band combine with a sensitivity learned from the Baka Pygmies in the African rainforest.

Maura O'Connell

Captivating stylist, musical explorer, songwriter's singer. Labels have never fully defined the talent of Maura O'Connell. Self-described as "just a singer," Maura's multi-decade singing career has brought her international acclaim and two Grammy nominations. 
