



# Autumn's Palette

In autumn, the Cuyahoga Valley transforms into a living art exhibit. Upland and lowland forests dazzle us with the glorious colors of turning leaves on deciduous trees. Within each valley habitat, wildlife hurriedly prepares for winter's bleakness, offering glints of other hues. Every few weeks, the palette changes as different natural events take stage.

In mid-September, look for splendid arrays of autumn wildflowers. Yellow goldenrod, pink Joe Pye weed, and light purple New England aster splash across old fields and pastures. In turn, these attract nectar-feeding monarchs with their striking stained-glass pattern of orange and black. On Sunday, September 21, come observe these butterflies during the height of their migration (see page 3).

Starting in late September, early leaf changes begin to appear. Summer greens take their final bows. With each

passing day, the forests brighten until reaching their peak during the third week of October. Forests flame with the brilliant yellow-reds of sugar maple, deep reddish purples of dogwood, glowing oranges of sassafras, and striking yellows of poplar. Families can Walk in the Woods on Sunday, September 28, to discover these early seasonal delights (see page 3).

Late October to early November marks the apex of waterfowl migration. The neutral colors of immature birds blend with the browning marshlands. On Saturday, October 25, bird watchers can gather to witness their southern journey at the Beaver Marsh (see page 2).

Don't miss nature's show this season. We look forward to another great performance. Artistry awaits at Cuyahoga Valley National Park.



## Migrating Monarchs




