



Remembering the Flood of 1913

On March 26, 1913, the *Akron Beacon Journal* headline screamed: "Worst Flood in Ohio History with Dayton Center of Horror." The accompanying article reported "a calamity which can only be compared to the death, destruction, horrors, and devastation of war has overtaken the state of Ohio."

Between March 23 and 27, the equivalent of two to three months' worth of rain fell across the Ohio Valley. Every river and stream in the state flooded. The resulting destruction was devastating. Bridges, roads, railways, dams, and property were washed away. An estimated 500 people drowned, a quarter of a million were left homeless, and damages were estimated in the hundreds of millions. It was the most widespread natural disaster that the United States had witnessed, engulfing parts of 15 states.

Out of the chaos came better flood awareness; a new system of dams, levees, and floodwalls; and the realization that the

federal government needed to become involved in large-scale emergency responses.

This March, the national park and its partners will take a look back at this powerful event, the lives it touched, and its legacy. Join us on Friday, March 22, for a Lyceum lecture by author Trudy E. Bell, the foremost expert on the Flood of 1913, preceded by a flood-themed dinner. We are also commemorating the 100-year anniversary through a special Sunday Matinee train program, guided hikes in Boston and Akron, and an exhibit of artifacts and photos. The monumental flood of 1913 was the worst natural disaster to befall Ohio. Largely forgotten is the national impact of this massive storm system. Tornadoes destroyed and flooding engulfed portions of 15 states, disrupting communications and

manufacturing from the industrial North to the Mississippi River to the agricultural South. Although damaged itself, Cleveland was a first responder during the first critical week when outside help could not get through. This presentation includes rarely seen images. 


Bike the Trail, Ride the Rail!

Bird Watching


