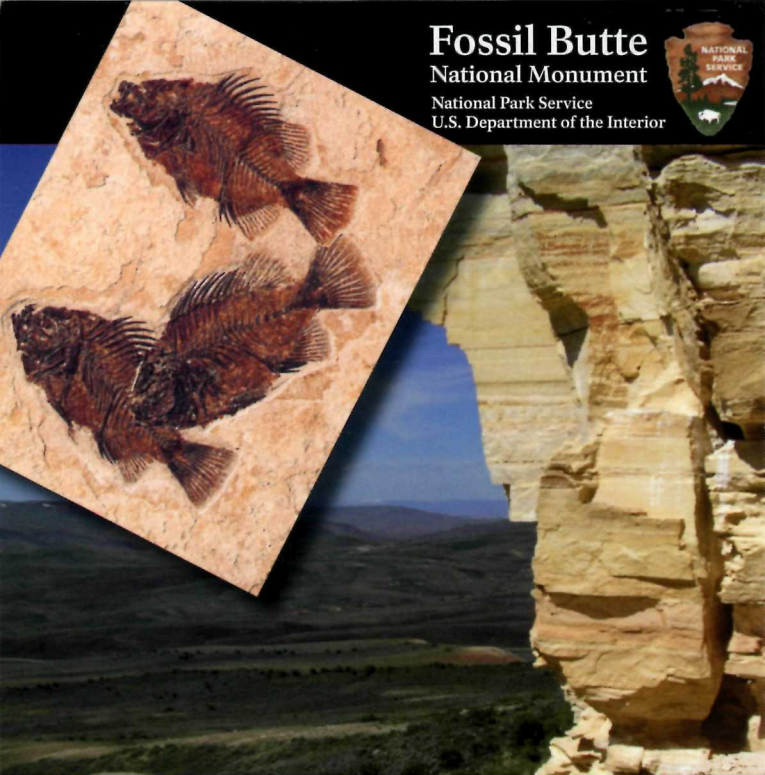


Fossil Butte National Monument

Located in southwest Wyoming, Fossil Butte National Monument preserves one of the richest fossil deposits in the world. Fifty million-year-old fish, insects, birds, mammals, reptiles, and plants are nearly perfectly preserved in limestone.



Visitor Center

Exhibits include over 300 fossils featuring a thirteen-foot crocodylian, the oldest complete bats, and a mass mortality of 356 fish. Also, enjoy two video programs, interactive exhibits, and a book store.



HISTORIC QUARRY TRAIL

Get close to the rocks on this 2.5-mile loop. Wayside exhibits highlight the geology, paleontology, wildlife, and local history.

CHICKEN CREEK NATURE TRAIL

View wildlife and flowers along this 1.5-mile loop trail through sagebrush and aspen groves.

RANGER PROGRAMS

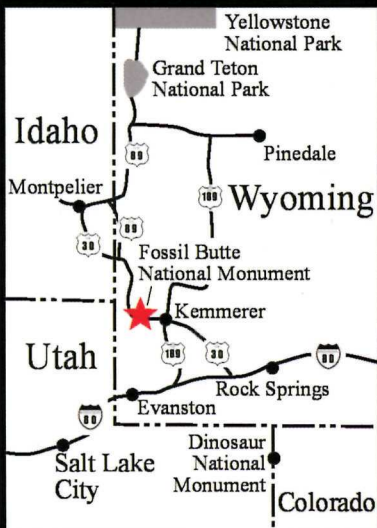
Presented daily Memorial Day through Labor Day. Groups welcome year around, call to schedule.

CHICKEN CREEK PICNIC AREA

Nestled along the edge of an aspen grove 2.5 miles from the visitor center, the picnic area is open daylight hours from May through October.

JR & SR RANGER

Free programs for ages 5-15 and 16 and older, allow 1-2 hours.
