Fort Frederica National Monument is one of over 400 sites administered and protected by the National Park Service. The site is located on St. Simons Island, Glynn County, Georgia.

There exist numerous opportunities for wildlife oriented public use at Fort Frederica including bird watching. Bird habitats at this site include forested area, open field, and coastal zones. These diverse habitats and relatively small geographic area offer numerous opportunities to observe a nice variety of both migratory and resident bird species throughout the year.

The following bird list contains close to 100 species, representing observations made by the National Park Service's inventory and monitoring program, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and park volunteers. Please report the sightings of additional species to the ranger staff.
