Building a wigwam

Fort Necessity National Battlefield offers a 3 hour program in which boy scouts earn the Indian Lore merit badge. At the end of the program the on-site merit badge councelor will sign the boys' blue cards. The program features handson activities.

History of an American Indian Nation

Requirement 1

The boys will learn about the three nations that were present in western Pennsylvania in the 1750's – the Shawnee, the Delaware and the Seneca. They will learn many aspects of their dress, appearance, beliefs and life style. Pictures, clothing and artifacts are used.

Wigwam and Museum Artifacts

Requirement 2

The boy scouts will either build a full size replica of a wigwam (if they come on the Indian Lore weekend) or they will build a model of one. The boys will also study 10 artifacts in the parks museum.

American Indian Games Requirement 3

The group will be divided in half. Each group will learn two games, however, they will not learn the same games. Afterwards each group of boys can teach the other group of boys their game.

The Iroquois Confederacy Requirement 4

The park ranger will use storytelling to explain about the formation of the Iroquois Confederacy and their system of government.
