

entrance of Charleston Harbor. The South demanded that Fort Sumter be vacated. The North refused. Finally, on April 12,1861, South Carolina Confederate troops from nearby Fort Johnson fired on the fort—the start of a two day bombardment that resulted in the surrender of Fort Sumter by Union troops.

With the North's withdrawal, the South held the fort until it was finally evacuated on February 17, 1865. During that time, the fort experienced one of the longest sieges in modern warfare. For almost two years, 46,000 shells, estimated at more than seven million pounds of metal, were fired at Fort Sumter. For these reasons and more, Fort Sumter remains one of the most significant historic monuments in the United States.





The primary departure point for visitors to Fort Sumter is the National Park Service Visitor Education Center, located next to the South Carolina Aquarium at Concord and Calhoun streets. It is a state-of-the-art facility, serving as an interpretive educational center for the National Park Service to communicate the significance of Fort Sumter and its history. Exhibits provide an overview of the many issues and debates that led to the outbreak of the Civil War.

The Visitor Center is open daily from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm, and admission is free.


FORT SUMTER TOURS' ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITMENT
