Lake McDonald

Departing from Lake McDonald Lodge boat dock at the north end of the lake, our SceniCruises cross to the west shore to view more remote areas. The popular evening cruise offers passengers spectacular sunsets over the serene lake.

Many Glacier

Enjoy unique, awe-inspiring views. Several of the Park's larger glaciers can be seen from a Many Glacier SceniCruise. Cross Swiftcurrent Lake, take a short .2-mile walk, then board another launch to the head of Lake Josephine. Boat schedule accommodates hiking and picnicking in the back country.

From early July, an 8:30 a.m. cruise is added for hikers to Grinnell Glacier, accompanied by a Ranger-Naturalist (adults \$7.00, children \$3.50). Naturalist-guided walks also available to Grinnell Lake on 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. cruises.

EXCEPTIONS TO SCHEDULES BELOW: June & Sept. departures reduced to 9, 11, 2 & 4 o'clock cruises only.

Two Medicine

Two Medicine area SceniCruises offer back country experiences without back country effort. On 1 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. cruises you may join a Naturalist for the optional .9-mile walk to Twin Falls. On Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday at 10:30 a.m. you can join a Ranger Naturalist guided hike of 5 miles round trip to Upper Two Medicine Lake, returning on a later cruise. Sunset cruise daily at 6:45 p.m., July and August only.

St. Mary Lake

Offering some of the finest views in Glacier Park, St. Mary Lake SceniCruises feature views of Sexton Glacier, waterfalls, rugged cliffs and primitive forests. Passengers on the 9 a.m. cruise have the best photo opportunities in the park with spectacular lighting and calm waters. In July and August only, passengers at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. can enjoy an optional 2-hour walk to St. Mary Falls with a Naturalist and return later. Optional 15-minute walks to Baring Falls are offered on all but the Sunset Cruises.

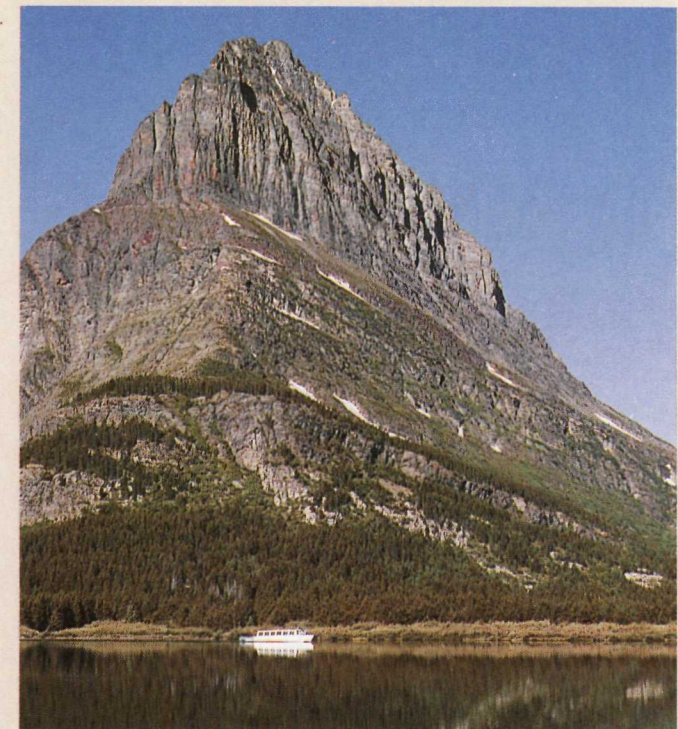
