



North Rim Campground

As the only campground on the North Rim of Grand Canyon National Park, the North Rim Campground offers a tranquil setting for an enjoyable camping experience with close access to the canyon and park facilities. Follow these guidelines to help preserve this amazing place for future generations.

Rules and Regulations

Quiet hours: 10 pm to 6 am.

Please be considerate to your fellow campers throughout the day.

Generator hours: 7–9 am and 6–8 pm.

Generators may not be used in the Tent Only area.

Check in/out time: Check in at noon; check out at 11 am. If sites are available, renew after 9 am. Stays limited to 7 consecutive days and 30 days per calendar year.

Food: Store food and trash in your vehicle or hardsided container. Do not leave pet food outside. This precaution not only protects us, but a host of Grand Canyon wildlife including elk, deer, ravens, ground squirrels, and even mountain lions.

Trash: Deposit in the dumpsters near each restroom. Do not leave trash unattended or hang trash from trees—ravens and other animals will scatter it. You are responsible for cleaning up your site.

Trenching and digging: To prevent erosion, ground disturbance is not permitted.

Vehicles: Cars, trucks, motorcycles, and trailers must remain on the pavement. Do not park in the road. Maximum vehicle length: 40 feet (12 m).

Fires: Limited to camp stoves and fire rings provided at each site. Drown fires completely before leaving the site, even for a short while. Do not construct rock fire rings or put ashes and charcoal in dumpsters.

Washing: Do not bathe, wash dishes, or do laundry at water spigots. Wash dishes in restroom sinks. Do not scatter waste water.

Pets: Must be kept on a leash and under physical control at all times. Do not leave pets unattended. Pets are permitted on the Bridle Path, but are not allowed on any other trail. Pets are not permitted below the rim or in buildings.

Hanging items: All clotheslines, hammocks, and sports nets must be taken down when not in immediate use. This will prevent wildlife from becoming ensnared and protect your property. Do not pierce trees with nails or other sharp objects.

Services

Drinking water: See map for locations. Water is a precious resource; use it conservatively.

Firewood: Purchase wood at the General Store. Do not gather firewood.

Pay showers, laundry, and change: Available across from the Registration Kiosk.

Water tanks: Fill at the dump station. Do not attach hoses to campground faucets

Operations

All sites are reserved. Changing sites may not be possible due to limited availability. Please do not move once checked in unless approved by the park ranger at the kiosk.

Sites 3–78: Limited to six people, three tents, and two vehicles.

Tent only sites: Limited to one large tent or two small tents and one vehicle. All tents must be set up on the tent pad.

Group sites: A, B, and C may have up to 25 people and three vehicles. Commercial groups, regardless of size, must stay in a group site.
