Lost Creek Campground Information

Welcome to Lost Creek Campground (elevation 5700')

Camping in Lassen Volcanic National Park can be a fun and rewarding experience. Remember that you are sharing this space with plants, animals, and other campers. Consideration and cooperation are important.

Obtaining a Campsite

Lost Creek Group Campground has eight campsites. Reservations may be made up to 12 months in advance online at www. recreation.gov, or by calling 1-877-444-6777. The cost for group sites is \$60 per night. For arrivals with campsite reservations proceed to assigned site and verify name and dates listed on the reservation card on campsite post. Checkout time is 12 pm.

Campsites

Each campsite is equipped with three picnic tables, three fire grates, three bear-proof boxes, and parking area. Electric and water hookups are not available, though potable water spigots are available in the campground. Campsites can accommodate a minimum of 10 to a maximum of 25 persons, and up to 6 cars or 1 bus/RV per site. Vehicles must stay on paved/graveled areas. Help protect park resources; please do not trench or level your site or put nails in trees.

Quiet Hours and Generators

Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 6 am.

Generators may be used only from 8 am to 10 am; 12 pm to 2 pm; and 5 pm to 7 pm. Do not run continually and please keep use to a minimum so other campers are not disturbed.

Food Storage and Wildlife

This is bear country and deer, squirrels, and chipmunks are also year-round residents. Store all food in bear-proof box provided at your campsite, including pet food. It is illegal to feed, frighten, or disturb any wildlife. All resources such as wildflowers, plants, animals, and artifacts are protected by law in national parks. Please leave them for others to enjoy.

Campfires

Do not cut, saw, or break any standing trees, dead or alive for firewood. You may gather dead wood that is down on the ground within 30 feet of the road and less than 4 inches in diameter. Chainsaw use is not permitted. Fires are allowed only in designated fire grates. Do not build rock rings or burn trash in the grate. Never leave fires or hot coals unattended and extinguish them completely before leaving.

Sanitation

Wash dishes at your campsite, not at water spigots. Please do not wash clothes, hair, or bathe at water spigots. Strained dishwater must be disposed of in the vault toilets. Dispose of food particles in trash bins. Gray water from RVs and trailers must be contained and disposed of at the Manzanita Lake dump station in the northwest part of the park. Water is a precious and limited resource; use it wisely. Please sort and place all trash and recyclables in the appropriate bins.

Camper Store, Laundry, and Showers (Manzanita Lake)

California Guest Services, the official park concessioner, operates the rental cabins, showers, laundry, and Manzanita Lake Camper Store. Showers and laundry machines take quarters. There is a change machine located by the showers.

Vehicles and Bicycles

All roads in the campground are one-way and the speed limit is 10 mph. Keep all vehicles on paved areas at all times. Bicycles are permitted on paved areas only.

Visitor Services

Visitor centers have exhibits, maps, videos, publications, and hiking information. The Kohm Yah-mah-nee Visitor Center is located approximately 28 miles from Manzanita Lake at the southwest entrance to the park; Loomis Museum is located in the plaza approximately one mile beyond the northwest entrance of the park.

Pets

Pets must be attended and on a leash not longer than 6 feet at all times. It is the owner's responsibility to clean up after them. Pets are not permitted on trails or inside park facilities.


Emergencies
