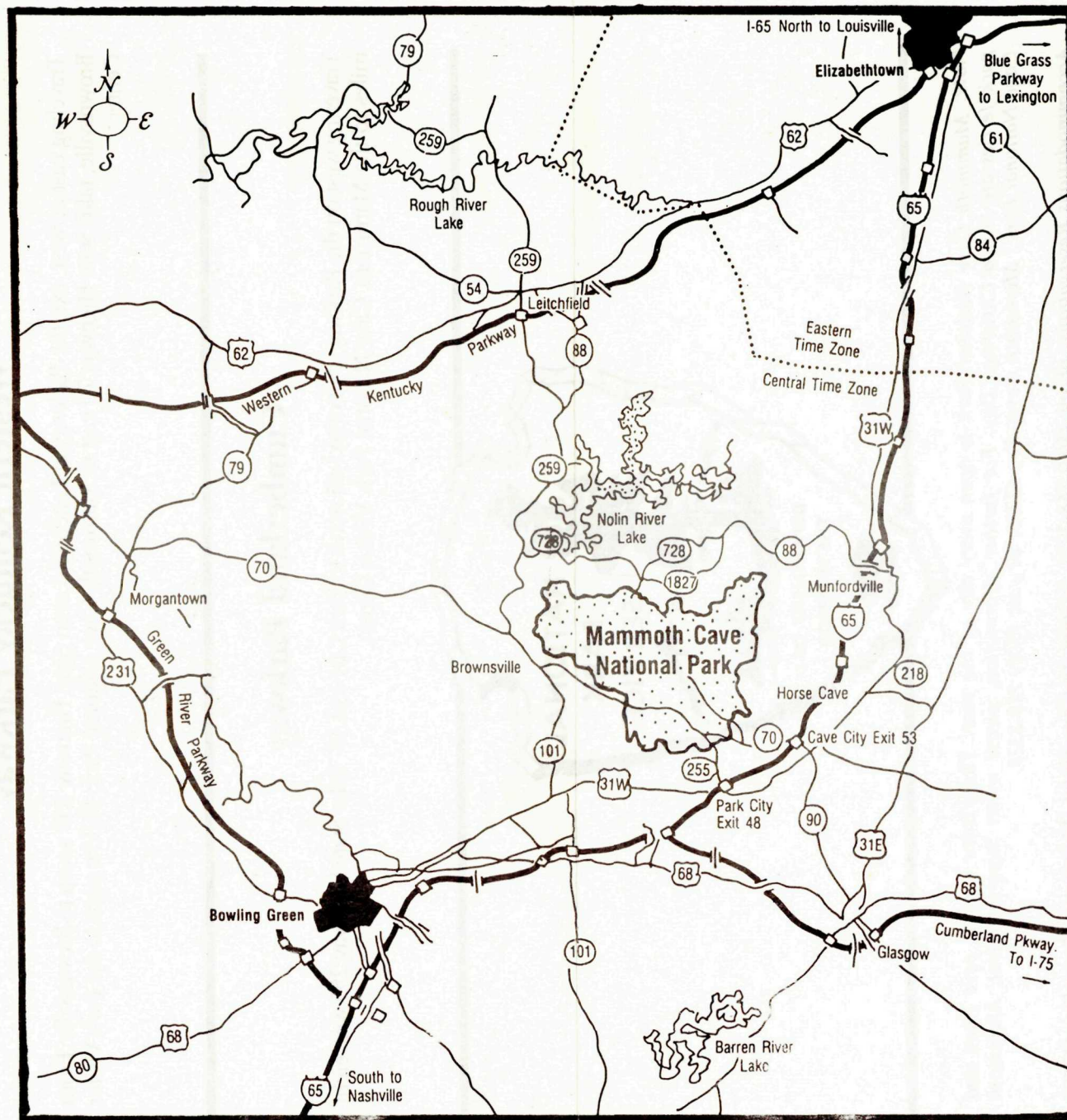


Mammoth Cave National Park

Mammoth Cave National Park is located in South Central Kentucky, halfway between Louisville, Kentucky and Nashville, Tennessee. Located along the I-65 corridor, Mammoth Cave was first opened for tours in 1816, and became a National Park in 1941. It is the world's longest cave and was designated a World Heritage Site in 1981.

Today, Mammoth Cave National Park can easily be reached from the main Parkway and Interstate Highway systems in South Central Kentucky. Directions from these systems are on the reverse side of this map.



Interstate Highway I-65

Traveling south on I-65, take exit 53 at Cave City, then take State Highway 70 west nine miles to the Mammoth Cave National Park Visitor Center.

Traveling north on I-65, take exit 48 at Park City, then take State Highway 255 west eight miles to the Mammoth Cave National Park Visitor Center.

Green River Parkway

Traveling South on Green River Parkway, take the Morgantown exit onto State Highway 231 east to the junction of Highway 70 east, then take 70 through Brownsville to Mammoth Cave National Park. Follow signs to the Park Visitor Center.

Western Kentucky Parkway

Traveling east or west, exit the Parkway at Leitchfield onto State Highway 259 south to Brownsville. From Brownsville, take State Highway 70 east to Mammoth Cave National Park. Follow signs to the Park Visitor Center.

Cumberland Parkway

Traveling west on the Parkway, exit onto I-65 north to Park City exit 48. Take State Highway 255 west eight miles to the Mammoth Cave National Park Visitor Center.
