

# Kirtland Temple

A National Historic Landmark



**F**or generations visitors have explored the majestic Kirtland Temple. Religious seekers gathered in Kirtland under the direction of Joseph Smith Jr. and built their first temple between 1833 and 1836. Distinctive features include richly carved wooden pulpits on both ends of the sanctuary. When finished, it was one of the largest buildings in northern Ohio. The temple stood at the center of community life for more than 2,000 believers by 1838. Within a year, all but 100 were gone.

# Visit Kirtland Temple

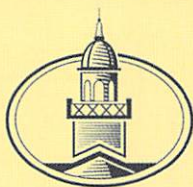
- May–October: Monday–Saturday: 9AM–5PM, Sunday: 1PM–5PM
- March–April, November–December: Wednesday–Saturday; 10AM–4PM, Sunday: 1PM–4PM, Closed Monday and Tuesday

Kirtland is located approximately 22 miles east of Cleveland.

From the east or west: Take I-90 to State Route 306. Go south approximately 1 mile. The Temple and Visitor Center are located on the right side of the road.

From the south: Take I-271 north to I-90 east to State Route 306.
