April 10-11: Lifeways of the Cherokee Indians & Colonial Settlers



French & Indian War era camp. This unique program features an authentic encampment of living history interpreters who portray soldiers and women of the mid-1700s. Get ready to step back in time before the days of the Revolution when there were Indians, a few hardy settlers, and the King's men who were trying to protect his subjects on the frontier.

(Usually held the 1st weekend in April- special date because of Easter.)

May 15, June 19, July 17, August 21: Living History Saturdays 10am to 2pm


Living History reenactors display Colonial skills such as musket firing, woodworking, fireplace cooking, candle making, crafts, and baking in the Beehive oven. Special talks and tours will also be available.



October 9: Annual Candlelight Tour

Guided tours proceed along the one-mile historic trail, which is illuminated by the soft glow of candlelight and torchlight. Along the way, costumed volunteers portray Colonial citizens and soldiers who tell stories of peace and war at old Ninety Six in the 1700's.





November 27: A Backcountry Holiday 1- 4pm

Start a new holiday tradition with your family by stepping back into history. The past will come to life as you walk into the historic late 18th century Black Swan Tavern, where costumed interpreters will be demonstrating Backcountry life in the 1700s during the holidays.
