



Nine black students brave unthinkable prejudice and hate as they take their first steps toward Central High School, testing the Supreme Court's affirmation of equal education under the law.

The story of the commitment of brave citizens determined to gain equal rights is told at historic sites like *Little Rock Central High School* and *Brown v. Board of Education*. The *Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historic Site* and the *Selma to Montgomery National Historic Trail* chronicle the civil rights movement that changed the world.
