The Lower Suwannee National Wildlife Refuge was established in 1979 to protect the water quality of the Suwannee River estuary and provide habitat for wildlife.

In Order to Hunt You Must:

1. Have a state hunting license or be exempt.
2. Purchase a Refuge Hunt permit from GoOutdoorsFlorida.com under the "Apply/Buy Leftover Permits" tab. (Walmart may carry these as hunt permit number 7800.)

3. Understand and carry a current Refuge Hunt Regulations brochure- either hard copy or on your phone. Each hunter is responsible for everything in this regulations brochure.

Reporting Deer:

Successful hunters are required to report their bag to the FWC's Harvest Reporting



System within 24 hours of harvest. FWC's instructions and log are available at:
