The Refuge is famous for its tremendous diversity and spectacular concentrations of wildlife. Boasting over 320 bird species and 58 mammal species.

Located 32 miles south of Burns our office is open Monday to Thursday 7:00 am to 4:30 pm and Friday 7:00 am to 3:30 pm. The Visitor Center is open Monday to Friday 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and is staffed most weekends by volunteers.

Experience our museum with nearly 200 mounted bird specimens, or hiking, biking, fishing, seasonal hunting, interpretative and educational activities. The 43-mile self guided auto tour route offers wildlife observation and photography opportunities.
