

Preserved for thousands of migratory waterfowl and home for endangered species, Pahranagat National Wildlife Refuge is a wildlife treasure of unparalleled beauty.

The calls of colorful mallards, grebes, and herons echo across the water to their newly hatched young during spring and early summer. Cottonwoods display brilliant oranges and yellows as the wetlands fill with migrating waterfowl each fall. In winter the refuge's most majestic visitors, bald eagles, feast on the wetlands' fish.

Lakeside picnic areas and an abundance of trails offer visitors a tranquil opportunity to enjoy the wildlife whether taking photographs, hiking, kayaking, canoeing, or birding. Hunting is also permitted on the southern portion of the refuge on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays during the state hunting season.
