Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge

Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge sits along 37 miles of the Green River in southwestern Wyoming. In a landscape dominated by desert and drought, the river serves as an oasis for wildlife. This 27,230-acre Refuge protects a variety of habitat types including the river corridor, wetlands, and sagebrush for over 350 species of wildlife.

The best times to visit the Refuge are during the spring, summer, and fall. Thousands of waterfowl, shorebirds, raptors, and songbirds migrate through the Refuge each year, and some, like trumpeter swans and bald eagles, nest here. Look for these and other wildlife, such as pronghorn and moose, along the auto tour route. Learn about Refuge wildlife and their habitats through exhibits in the Environmental Education Center. Step back in time, and experience the historic Oregon, Mormon, California, or Pony Express trails, all of which cross the Refuge. Enjoy hunting and fishing during State seasons in compliance with Refuge regulations.

The auto tour route is open during daylight hours year-round, weather and road conditions permitting. The Refuge office is open Monday through Friday, 7:30 am to 4:30 pm. It is closed on weekends, as well as Federal holidays.

To reach the Refuge, take Exit 83 - La Barge Road/ Highway 372 - from Interstate 80 west of Green River, Wyoming, and travel northwest 37 miles.
