This goose, designed by J.N. "Ding" Darling in the 1930s, has become a symbol of the National Wildlife Refuge System.

Senev National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) was established in 1935 for the protection and production of migratory birds and other wildlife. The refuge's 95,238 acres include a rich mosaic of marshes, swamps, bogs and forests, which provide habitat for over 200 species of birds. Senev NWR is known for its abundance of trumpeter swans, common loons, bald eagles, osprey and sandhill cranes, which are commonly seen while driving the Marshland Wildlife Drive or walking the Pine Ridge Nature Trail. Other familiar favorites include the American bittern, rails, and numerous warbler species found on the refuge.

If you are searching for a specific bird, a little research into its favorite habitat and typical behaviors may be helpful. Bird identification guides and binoculars can be checked out from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm at the Visitor Center from May 15th to October 15th for your viewing pleasure.

Please keep these ethical wildlife observation tips in mind while visiting the refuge.

- 1. Observe and photograph wildlife without chasing or repeatedly flushing the animal.
- 2. Stay an appropriate distance from nests so the parents are not scared away, leaving the chicks exposed to danger.
- 3. Overwintering birds need all their energy to survive. Avoid disturbing them if possible.
- 4. Birds and other wildlife depend on plants such as berries and seeds for food. Please be considerate of these needs.
- 5. Stay on existing roads, trails and pathways to avoid trampling habitat.
- 6. Be sure to take all trash with you, as wildlife has been known to die when becoming entangled in fishing line or after consuming litter.

7. Respect all signs, laws and regulations. Areas may be closed to reduce disturbance to nesting or migrating birds.

The Marshland Wildlife Drive is closed to motorized vehicles from October 15th to May 15th each year for the protection of migratory, resident and nesting birds.

Primary sources for this list include the Seney Comprehensive Conservation Plan, volunteers, researchers, staff members, and the American Birding Association. This list includes birds known to be found on the Seney NWR and surrounding lands. If you should find an interesting or unusual species, please stop by the Visitor Center and record it in the observation log. Photos are always appreciated.
