

Spring Creek National Fish Hatchery was established in 1901 as one of several egg collection stations on the Columbia River. Initially it produced salmon in response to overfishing. Today, the hatchery annually raises 10.5 million Tule Fall Chinook salmon to support the commercial and recreational salmon harvest in British Columbia, along the Washington coast, and in the Columbia River. The hatchery also fulfills tribal trust responsibilities. Tules are native to this part of the Columbia River, historically providing food for the native people living along the river. Native Americans called them *mitula*, or "white salmon", because of their light colored flesh. The first ¼ mile of the entrance road is the State Park.

# Fishing Opportunities Near **Spring Creek National Fish Hatchery**



## 1 Drano Lake

Largemouth bass, rainbow trout, yellow perch, salmon, steelhead, sturgeon



From the hatchery, turn left on SR-14. Travel 5.4 mi.; the lake will be on the north side of the highway.

## 2 Rowland Lake

Rainbow trout, largemouth bass, bluegill, black crappie, white crappie



From the hatchery, turn right on SR-14. Travel 9.8 mi., turn left on County Road 1230, follow road for 0.3 miles. Access is on the right; the lake is on the north side of the highway.

## 3 Columbia River (Spring Creek National Fish Hatchery; Spring Creek Hatchery State Park)

Salmon, summer steelhead, white sturgeon, rainbow trout, smallmouth bass



## 4 White Salmon River (Spring Creek NFH Big White Ponds)

Chinook salmon, summer steelhead, rainbow trout

**No amenities**

Turn right from hatchery until you reach Highway SR-14, turn left, drive 7.2 mi. to Highway 141 Alt north, follow to SW Arnett Road. Limited parking near the locked gate entrance. Walk ¼ mile to reach river access.

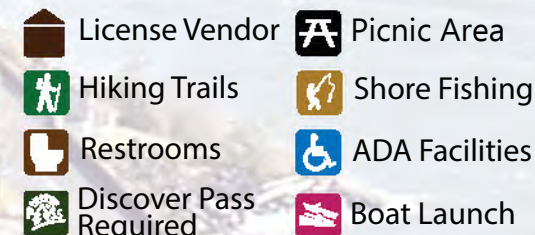
