White River National Wildlife Refuge, established in 1935, contains over 157,000 acres of prime bottomland hardwood habitat located within the floodplain of the lower White River. For management purposes, most of the lands within the refuge have been divided into a North Unit and a South Unit which are separated by Arkansas Highway 1. A few scattered tracts which are isolated from the main body of the refuge are not depicted on the accompanying maps. Public hunting and fishing are permitted on the refuge in accordance with State and Federal regulations as supplemented by the following special refuge regulations.



Access and Vehicle Use

Refuge roads on the South Unit are open to vehicular traffic March 1 through December 15. All other refuge roads are open year around. A locked gate, road closed sign, or other barrier means the road is closed to all vehicle travel but not to foot travel unless signed otherwise. On the South Unit, ATV's may be used only on trails marked with yellow paint; all other vehicles must stay on either gravel roads or those roads marked with yellow paint. On the North Unit, south of the Noram Gas Pipeline, ATV's may be used only on trails marked with yellow paint; all other vehicles must stay on either gravel roads or those roads marked with yellow paint. On lands north of the Noram Gas Pipeline, all vehicles, including ATV's, must stay on established roads. The use of ATV's on gravel roads is prohibited anywhere on the refuge, unless signed otherwise. An ATV is defined as any vehicle with a maximum tire pressure of 5 psi. All other non-licensed vehicles are prohibited on the refuge.

Boats, other than flat-bottomed johnboats 16 feet or less in length, may not be left overnight on the refuge during the period from November 1 through February 28. Boats, ATV's, and Portable tree stands left unattended on the refuge must have the owner's name and address affixed in a conspicuous manner.



Camping

Camping by the general public is permitted year around on the North Unit and at Jacks Bay, Moon Lake, Hudson's Landing, and the Floodgate campgrounds on the South Unit. All remaining campgrounds on the South Unit are open for camping from March 1 through December 31.



Fires are permitted only at camp sites. All fires must be extinguished when the camp is unoccupied.

Cutting or defacing trees is prohibited. Down wood may be used at campsites.

Camping is permitted only in designated camping areas shown on the accompanying map on the entire South Unit, on that portion of the North Unit located south of the Noram Gas Transmission Pipeline, and that portion of the North Unit south of U.S. Highway 79 west of the White River to the mouth of Roc Roe Bayou.

During the quota permit deer hunts on the South Unit, camping is restricted to quota permit holders only.

Electric generators and other disturbing noises at campgrounds are prohibited after 10:00 pm.

General Hunt Regulations

All forms of man-deer drives are prohibited.



Hunting is prohibited in areas closed to hunting as indicated on the accompanying maps or as otherwise posted.

Hunting from roadways, levees, and maintained utility rights-of-way is prohibited.

Mobility-impaired hunters may apply for a special permit which will allow hunting from an ATV on refuge roads. Issuance of the permit is restricted to persons who are permanently confined to a wheelchair, require the use of mechanical aids (crutches and walkers) to walk or have complete single leg amputations. For more information, please call the refuge at 870-946-1468.

It is illegal to drive or screw any metal object into a tree or to hunt from a tree in which a metal object has been driven or screwed. All hunting stands must be removed from the refuge after each hunt.

The placing of or hunting with the aid of bait, salt or ingestible attractant (i.e. deer cocaine) is prohibited.
