


An Invitation to Enjoyment: Federal Recreation Lands of the United States

Most Federal lands with recreation activities are shown; however, military installations and Indian tribal lands, some of which offer recreation opportunities, and State recreation lands are not shown. Squares indicate Federal areas of 5,000-22,500 acres; smaller areas less than 5,000 acres are symbolized by dots but are not named on this map.
