



HIKING SAFETY TIPS

Ticks are plentiful this time of year and some of them carry disease. Check your clothing and exposed skin after hiking. Southern Pacific Rattlesnakes make the mountains their home. Stay away from them and they won't bother you. In case of rattlesnake bite DO NOT make an incision or try to draw out venom. Splint the extremity and transport to an emergency room.

Wear sturdy footwear - hiking boots or sneakers with good tread.

Poison oak can be identified by its clusters of three shiny leaflets. The best way to avoid it is to stay on trails.

Never hike alone, use the buddy system. That leaves someone to go for help if you encounter trouble.

Help prevent wildfires. Do not smoke on the trail or in brush areas. Do not build fires on the ground.

Carry plenty of water and drink it. One quart for short walks, more for longer hikes.
