# Wildlife Checklist



A Prairie Refuge	<ul> <li>Dry summers, frigid winters, unceasing wind, and seemingly endless expanses of grass make the Northern Great Plains a challenging land of extremes. Animals adapted to this ever-changing climate including the largest, smallest, and fastest land animals in the continental United States: bison, masked shrews, and pronghorns, respectively. The plains are also home to keystone species such as the prairie dog, a native species many other animals depend upon for their own survival.</li> <li>Theodore Roosevelt National Park provides an important refuge for these animals and an opportunity for you to observe them in their natural habitat. Wildlife Watching Tips	HabitatThe majority of Theodore Roosevelt National Park is grasslands habitat, but the park also includes cotton- wood riverbottoms, juniper slopes, riparian zones, and other habitat types. Recognizing these differ- ences can help you spot certain animals according to their habitat preferences. Some maps show forests and prairie dog towns, which can help with planning.Timing Looking for wildlife at different times of day can	<ul> <li>mid-day, whereas bison are out in the open most of the time. Patience also helps, as staying quietly in one spot for a time may reveal more wildlife.</li> <li>Ask a Ranger</li> <li>Park staff may be able to assist you with general guidance or current information on where to look for certain species.</li> <li>Safety &amp; Regulations</li> <li>Enjoy wildlife at a distance. Do not approach,</li> </ul>
	make all the difference. Some species, like elk, are more visible at dawn and dusk, and difficult to spot	harass, or feed any wildlife. It is illegal to use animal calls or to use spotlights.
