



GRIZZLY BEAR

**Wildlife may not know better—but YOU do!
Give them room: Stay away 100 yards!**

Grizzly bears are omnivores. They may eat seeds, berries, roots, grasses, animals (alive or dead), fish, and insects. They can smell food from several miles away and run at speeds up to 30 miles (48 km) per hour. Grizzlies use “rub trees” to scratch their backs, leaving behind their scent and hair. Biologists can collect these hairs to learn about the bears through DNA analysis.

When they obtain food from humans, grizzly bears learn to associate humans with food. This is dangerous for both people and bears and can cause the bear to be lethally removed from the population.
