## Different Ways to Fight for Freedom

Tubman's friend, Frederick Douglass, compared their work as abolitionists and crusaders for freedom in an 1868 letter to her. He contrasted the public praise he received with Tubman's dangerous Underground Railroad missions, saying, "I have received much encouragement at every step of the way. You, on the other hand, have labored in a private way."
