Harriet Tubman

Savvy and Courageous

Born: 1822, Dorchester Co., MD

Died: March 10, 1913, Auburn, NY

Born in Maryland, Tubman escaped slavery to freedom in the north, then risked her life to return about 13 times over 10 years to rescue more than 70 people—family members and friends. Tubman became the most famous “conductor” of the secret escape network known as the Underground Railroad and never lost a passenger.
