CHICKAMAUGA & Chattanooga National Military Park

GEORGIA & TENNESSEE

The Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park commemorates the battles between Union and Confederate armies who fought here in the fall of 1863 over control of Chattanooga, the gateway to the deep South. The Union was the ultimate victor, but not without 21,994 Union and 25,121 Confederate casualties, in some of fiercest fighting of the Civil War.

The Chickamauga Visitor Center near Fort Oglethorpe, and Lookout Mountain Visitor Center at Point Park feature museums, interpretive exhibits, living history presentations, and hiking trails.

A multi-media production "The Battle of Chickamauga", is shown at Chickamauga Battlefield Visitor Center.
