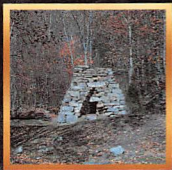

CUMBERLAND GAP NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

TENNESSEE & VIRGINIA

Early American settlers following Daniel Boone's Wilderness Trail and Native Americans on hunting missions were among the first to cross the territory of Appalachian Mountains known as the Cumberland Gap.

Today this national historical park features more than 55 miles of scenic hiking trails along with a visitor center in Middlesboro, Kentucky, with audiovisual exhibits, picnic facilities, campfire programs and other ranger-guided activities.

Other nearby attractions include June Tolliver House at Big Stone Gap (VA), Pine Mountain State Park (KY) and Lincoln Memorial University in Harrogate (TN).
