GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS



Known for the smoke-like haze that looms above the peaks, the Great Smoky Mountains are embraced by some of the greenest, most majestic forests in the world. These half-million acres of the Appalachian highlands are home to an abundance of plant and animal life. Perhaps the most stunning among them are the rhooddendron that flourish in summer.

History buffs enjoy the park's various restored structures from 19th-century farmsteads.

Clingmans Dome (6,642 feet), the park's highest point, has an observation tower providing eye-stretching vistas.
