## HALEAKALĀ NATIONAL PARK

MAUI, HAWAII

Haleakalā, which translated means “House of the Sun,” is the world’s largest dormant volcano and the central attraction of Haleakalā National Park on the island of Maui. The park extends from the subalpine cinder cone environment at the summit of Haleakalā, 10,023 feet above sea level, to the lush and tropical coast of Kīpahulu.

Many rare and endangered plant, bird and insect life abounds on this Hawaiian island. Many rare native plants and animals, found nowhere else on earth, are being seriously threatened by alien species such as bamboo, guava, mango, pigs, Argentine ants, cats, mongoose and rat.

Backcountry cabins (include bunks, firewood, cookstove) within Haleakalā Wilderness are available for rent on a lottery basis - apply at least 3 months in advance.
