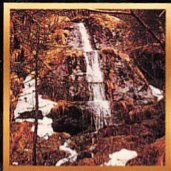

KENAI FJORDS NATIONAL PARK

SEWARD, ALASKA

This mostly remote region of the world captures the very essence of Alaska - snowcapped mountains, misty seascapes, rain forests and an abundance of marine life. Unique to this park, however, are the long, narrow ocean inlets wedged between the sea cliffs. These deep, ocean-filled canyons are known as the fjords. Chartering a boat or kayaking affords the best view of the fjords.

At the forefront of the park is the Harding Icefield, the source for most of the area's glaciers. The massive ice cap measures 20 by 35 miles, making it one of the largest in the United States.

SPECIAL INFORMATION
