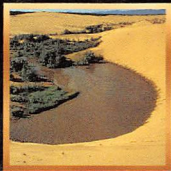

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KOBUK VALLEY NATIONAL PARK

KOTZEBUE, ALASKA

The adventure and uniqueness of the resources is what lures visitors to Kobuk Valley National Park, one of a few national parks north of the Arctic Circle. The Kobuk River is ideal for leisurely float trips. With its slow, winding course, kayaks, canoes and rafts travel no more than 15 to 20 miles per day.

Not far from the river is the Great Kobuk Sand Dunes, a 25-mile region of golden, wind-swept terrain.

Access to Kobuk Valley is limited to air travel. Visitors must possess adequate survival skills, as once you're flown in the park, you are on your own.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Pack adequate food, supplies and shelter, as none exists within the park. Sport hunting is unlawful, however firearms may be carried for bear protection.
