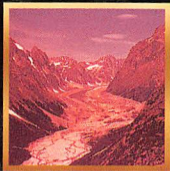

LAKE CLARK NATIONAL PARK & PRESERVE

ANCHORAGE, ALASKA

Lake Clark National Park and Preserve, set in the Chigmit Mountains, offers clear lakes, rushing rivers, cascading waterfalls, and a varied coastline for outdoor enthusiasts to enjoy.

Water from nearby mountain glaciers fill Lake Clark, the park's largest body of water. The area is home to an abundance of native fish including Arctic grayling, lake trout, Dolly Varden, rainbow trout, pike and red salmon.

Active volcanoes Redoubt and Iliamna, both over 10,000 feet tall, are part of the Pacific Ring of Fire, the myriad of volcanoes surrounding the Pacific Ocean.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

The park is 150 miles southwest of Anchorage and is not accessible by road. Much of the park is undeveloped, with no campgrounds. Limited accommodations and food service may be available seasonally. Visitors must carry sufficient provisions and be experienced in outdoor survival.
