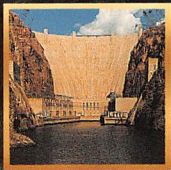

LAKE MEAD NATIONAL RECREATION AREA

BOULDER CITY, NEVADA

The recreation area stretches for nearly 140 miles along the Colorado River which divides Nevada and Arizona. It includes both Lake Mead created in 1935 by the Hoover Dam and Lake Mohave created in 1955 by the Davis Dam, providing 290 square miles of water in one of the driest climates on earth.

Beside the lakes, there are over a million acres in which to roam and play. There is swimming, boating, fishing, water skiing, camping, hiking, driving and hunting (in season). Boat and raft tours are popular as well.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Keep a watchfull eye on the weather and protect against sun with sunscreen, hat and tinted glasses. Don't under-estimate swimming distances to islands, across coves or to buoys. Be wary of poisonous oleander bushes often found near campsites.
