# MORRISTOWN NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

NEW JERSEY

George Washington's Continental Army endured two brutal winters at Morristown in 1777 and 1779-1780. Despite severe cold, inflated money, a lack of supplies and a mutiny of some troops, Washington still held his army together.

Morristown National Historical Park features a Museum and the Ford Mansion in Morristown. Jockey Hollow includes a Visitor Center, the Wick House and hiking trails. Living history demonstrations offer visitors a glimpse of camp life along with exhibits, films, guided tours and interpretive talks.

Among the attractions nearby are Edison National Historic Site and Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge.

Automobiles and bicycles must travel on paved roads and parking areas.
