MUIR WOODS NATIONAL MONUMENT

MILL VALLEY, CALIFORNIA

The 550 acre Muir Woods National Monument is located 20 minutes from the Golden Gate Bridge. Named for the renowned conservationist John Muir, it showcases nature at its best and is an example of old-growth forest. The United States received this precious land as a gift from Congressman William Kent and wife Elizabeth Thatcher Kent.

While picnicking, camping and bicycling are prohibited within the monument, the visitors center offers programs for youngsters. Self guided hiking trails weave through towering redwood forests and have informative trail markers and exhibits to enjoy while hiking.

The park facilities and major trails are handicap accessible.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Appropriate dress and footwear is recommended as the Red Wood Forest is often cool and trails become slippery when wet. Winter and spring are best months for visiting, as summer and early fall months are quite busy. • Site Manager, Muir Woods National Monument, Mill Valley, CA 94941 (415) 388-2595.
