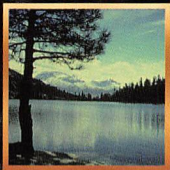

SEQUOIA AND KINGS CANYON NATIONAL PARKS

Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks, part of North America's longest continuous mountain range, are home to the biggest trees on earth, the tallest peak in the lower 48 states, and a portion of America's deepest canyon.

Sequoia is known for its stunning groves of giant sequoias, the world's largest living things. General Sherman, the largest, is 275 feet tall, 36.5 feet in diameter, and weighs an estimated 1,385 tons.

Kings Canyon plunges to a depth of 8,200 feet just outside the park boundary, where it is the deepest canyon in America - even deeper than Arizona's Grand Canyon.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Parks are black bear habitat; proper food storage is required. Watch for rattlesnakes, cougars, and ticks. Drowning is the primary cause of deaths. Park roads are steep and curving.
