With lobster buoys bobbing on the salty waves of the Adantic and clear, coastal skies above, Acadia National Park captures much of the New England spirit in these 41,000 acres. One of the more popular attractions is Cadilac Mountain, the tallest on the eastern seaboard, where the peak offers arresting views of evergreen forests and deep blue sea below.

Also exclusive to the eastern coast is Somes' sound, the region's only fjord.

The mountains, lakes, seashores, glacier-carved valleys and forests of Mount Desert Island are visible from the 20-mile Park Loop Road.
