Cape Krusenstern National Monument lies on a coastal plain dotted with lagoons and backed by gently rolling limestone hills that border the Chukchi Sea and Kotzebue Sound. The Monument protects and preserves archeological sites that trace 4,000 years of human use of the coastline. Iñupiaq Eskimos continue traditional hunting and fishing activities within the Monument.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

The Monument, located in northwest Alaska is 26 miles north of the Arctic Circle, has no trails or visitor facilities. There are no roads to the Monument, it can be reached by chartered small plane from Kotzebue.
