Colorado National Monument features towering red sandstone monoliths and deep, sheer-walled canyons. A variety of wildlife native to the area (bighorn sheep, golden eagles, mule deer and mountain lions) roam freely throughout the park. The 20,454-acre Monument was established May 24, 1911.
