ALASKA

Most refer to the highest mountain in North America as Mt. McKinley. In Alaska, the native Athabaskans call the mountain Denali or "the High One."

It has been said that perhaps no other place on earth offers such a rugged, unblemished view of nature as this subarctic region. The wildlife - grizzly bears, Dall sheep, moose, caribou, and wolves - roam free and uninhibited.

Enter a world far removed from lush forests and tropical environs. The highest mountains here are always covered with snow. Freezing temperatures keep the massive glaciers from melting away, and, even in summer, only a marginal layer of topsoil thaws.

**SPECIAL INFORMATION**
