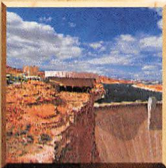

Glen Canyon National Recreation Area is an ideal location to enjoy water-based and backcountry recreation. The recreation area stretches hundreds of miles from Lees Ferry in Arizona to the Orange Cliffs of southern Utah, encompassing scenic vistas, geologic wonders, and a panorama of human history. Additionally, the controversy surrounding the construction of Glen Canyon Dam and the creation of Lake Powell contributed to the birth of the modern day environmental movement.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

Exhibits at the Carl Hayden Visitor Center at Glen Canyon Dam include dinosaur tracks, Glen Canyon during the Ice Age, and a three-dimensional map of the recreation area. The Bullfrog Visitor center, located at the Bullfrog Marina, offers geological and historical displays relating to Glen Canyon and the ancient Ancestral Puebloan Indians (also called Anasazi) who inhabited the region. • Superintendent, Glen Canyon National Recreation Area, P.
