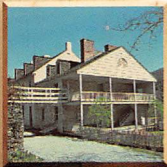

Harpers Ferry National Historical Park is located at the scenic confluence of the Shenandoah and Potomac Rivers. The park has a variety of exhibits, interpretive programs, and hiking trails exploring the park's six themes: Industry; John Brown; Civil War; African American History, particularly Storer College; Environmental History; and Transportation.

In 1944, Congress authorized a national monument here, and in 1963 the area was declared a National Historical Park. Many of the park's 19th century buildings are undergoing restoration.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

The park is approximately 65 miles northwest of Washington, D.C.; 20 miles southwest of Frederick, Maryland, via US 340. Signs along US 340 direct visitors to the Visitor Center and parking facility by turning at the signal light on US 340. Open year round—8:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m. Closed Christmas Day.
