This historic site includes the Truman Home in Independence, Missouri, and the Truman Farm Home in Grandview, Missouri. Harry S Truman (1884-1972), 33rd President of the United States, lived at the Truman Home from 1919 until his death. The white Victorian style house at 219 North Delaware Street was built by the maternal grandfather of Bess Wallace Truman (1885-1982), and was known as the "Summer White House" during the Truman Administration.

Constructed in 1894 by Harry Truman's maternal grandmother, the Truman Farm Home is the centerpiece of a 5-acre remnant of the family's former 600-acre farm.

SPECIAL INFORMATION
